STATEMENT OF DUTIES SPECIFIC TO THE ROLE

PASTORAL CARE

The subject teacher will demonstrate the pastoral care of his/her students by:

- Developing a positive rapport with all students.
- Attending to the needs of each student and the group as a whole.
- Exercising duty of care through effective, professional supervision.
- Maintaining constant supervision of a group for which responsibility has been allocated.
- Treating students with the respect to which their God-given dignity entitles them.

TEACHING

The subject teacher is responsible for:

- Programming for a particular course that is being taught in accordance with College policy.
- Planning thoroughly for each lesson.
- Presenting material and using strategies that accommodate multiple intelligences in such a manner so as to enhance student learning.
- Assessing student performance formally in accordance with College policy.
- Informing your teaching practice through an evaluation of your students' performance.
- Completing the formal process of reporting to parents in accordance with College policy.
- Contacting parents at other than formal reporting times, when a student's performance, achievement, attitude or behaviour is a cause for concern.
- Meeting deadlines set by Heads of Learning Area / College Administration.
- Keeping up to date with developments in relevant learning area/s and pedagogical methods, thereby actively contributing to the professional learning communities within the College.
- Complete annual learning goals through the College Professional Growth Process.
- Asking for professional assistance when appropriate.
- Acting upon professional advice when appropriate.
- Maintaining appropriate confidentiality in all matters relating to the College.
- Punctuality in regard to professional life.
- Completing reports accurately.
- Ensuring all students are engaged in learning.

MANAGING STUDENT BEHAVIOUR

The subject teacher will play a vital role in the discipline process by:

- Emphasising and fostering self-discipline.
- Encouraging a positive attitude and behaviour in students.
- Ensuring that students are aware of all College expectations, including behaviour, uniform and use of resources.
- Dealing appropriately with individuals and groups whose behaviour or attitude is not acceptable.
- Following the College's stated policies and procedures by keeping records and referring students to appropriate staff when necessary.

The subject teacher is required to:
